Royal dominate the Roy-Tho Regatta

Royal College balanced power and grace flawlessly on the waters of the Beira Lake on Saturday, October 23 to emerge first among equals at the foremost schools rowing event of the year – the Royal-Thomian Regatta.

Led by 4th Year Coloursman Radika Weerasekera, the Royalists won six of the eight races contested, and dominated the confident S.Thomas' crew to secure an overwhelming 34 -18 victory. Royal fielded ten Coloursmen this year.

The Royal Crews completely out rowed their opponents with record timings in the Senior Pair (Radika Weeraseka (Stroke) and Pradeep Maddumabandara (Bow) – 03.18) and the Junior (B) Four (Mewan Jayathilake (Bow), Ishan Perera (2), Sahan Warnasuriya (3), Sanjiva Jayasuriya (Stroke) and Supun Abayawardena (Cox) – 03.15) with wins also in the Junior Scull, Junior Double Scull, Senior Double Scull, Junior Pair, and C Four events. S.Thomas' won the Senior Four – the Boat Race. Their only other points came from a closely fought win in the Senior Scull. It is noteworthy that despite the Thomians using 2 Double Scull boats that were lighter in weight to those used by Royal, the Royal crews annihilated the Thomians in these two races as well.

Aqil Sulaiman (Grp of '04 & Captain '03), Ali Fatharally (Grp of '04), Reza Akram (Grp of '05), Hishan Hassen (Grp of '05) and Kosala Wikramanayake (Grp of '05) narrowly lost out to an

in-form Thomian outfit in the Old Boys' event.

The Chief Guest for the afternoon was Sanjaya Senerath, a former Thomian Captain and current President of the Colombo Rowing Club. This year's Regatta, sponsored by T-Sips (an Expolanka Brand), was hosted by S.Thomas' College, who ran a colourful event with large screen video coverage and spectacular fireworks that lit up the evening sky to cap the Royal celebrations in style. From February this year, the new Rowing Advisory & Management Committee of the RCU had contributed in a big way to regularise all matters relating to Royal Rowing. Rowing matters were previously addressed by a dedicated group of Old Boys. The Advisory & Management Committee was formed to enhance support increasing the sense of security and stability provided to the young Royal oarsmen. In its first 6 months, the Advisory Committee was able to donate a video camera, partially sponsor two boats acquired by the team, and arrange discussions and sessions with doctors regarding diet and nutrition, sports injury prevention and the all important psychological aspect of the sport. To this end, our Old Boys Dr. Harindu Wijesinghe, Dr. Thushantha Wijesinghe, Dr. Chamara Wijesinghe, Sarinda Unamboowe, the Old Boys working for HSBC overseas and the team's sponsor T-Sips need special mention.

With a strong crew retained to defend next year's title, and a growing community of enthusiastic young Royal oarsmen packing the crew each year, the future looks bright for rowing at the College.
